After the Listeriosis crisis in 2018, many new regulations have been introduced specifically affecting processed meat producers. Such as, R908 (HACCP), R 1283 (Composition & Labelling) and VC9100 (Facilities, Micro & HACCP).

SAMPA has extensively engaged with Food Safety Agency (R 1283) and NRCS (VC9100) regarding the enforcement of these new regulations. Our active engagement with these government regulators ensures our members interests are being heard at all times.
